#### **NAPLAN**

All year 3 and 5 students will participate in the National Assessment Program in Literacy and Numeracy in Week 7 and 8 of this term. This online assessment is administered to all year 3 and 5 students nationally and consists of 4 assessments in reading, writing, language conventions and numeracy. During week 6, all year 3 and 5 students will have a practice of a NAPLAN style short assessment mainly to test the log on and passwords for all students. A timetable for the assessments will be shared with year 3 and 5 families at the beginning of week 7.

#### **Assemblies**

Thank you to parents/carers for joining us at our first whole school assembly in week 3. It was wonderful to see so many families hear the fabulous musical performances after only 2 or 3 lessons with Mrs Robinson (Performing Arts). As mentioned in the previous newsletter we will host 3 assemblies each term, a whole school assembly, senior and junior assembly. At Taylor Primary School we have a number of ways we report on student achievement. Each of these strategies are aimed at providing families with clear feedback and an accurate understanding of their child's learning and wellbeing progress against the curriculum. Parents and carers are most welcome to make an appointment to see their child's teacher at any time throughout the year.
