Our students participated in activities to promote unity and kindness, reading stories and sharing special things about our different identities.

Sustainability

Taylor Primary students and staff participated in Clean up Australia Day to help keep our environment tidy. It was fabulous to see everyone involved. Caring for our

environment is also important to us. Another way students at Taylor are sustainable is through riding bikes and scooters to school and therefore minimising the number of cars on the roads. Our walk and ride to school day two weeks ago had a high number of students, parents and staff walking and riding to school. The bike track regularly has riders each day enjoying the outdoors.

The **Taylor Garden Project** is underway with thanks to a small group of parents, staff and students. The plans serve to make our garden easier to maintain with the addition of gravel paths and wicking beds. The plans to install a greenhouse and to create an Indigenous bush tucker garden in consultation with the community, will provide excellent educational opportunities for our students. We look forward to working alongside our P&C in transforming our school garden space into a rich learning environment that is loved by students, nurtures and deepens our understanding of Ngunnawal Country, and supports authentic teaching and learning of sustainability.

Enrolling in an ACT Public School for 2024- Preschool, Kindergarten, year 7 and year 11

Enrolments for the 2024 school year, for students transitioning schools or starting at a school, open 6am on Wednesday 26 April. Families can apply online. Information about the school in your child's Priority Enrolment Area can be found on the Education Directorate website. During the school holidays a list of school information sessions for prospective students will be published. Alternately you can visit school websites to find out more about your child's new school. Students currently enrolled at Taylor Preschool are not required to reapply for Kindergarten at Taylor unless placement was granted for the preschool year only. A survey to preschool families will be distributed early in Term 2 to confirm arrangements for kindergarten in 2024.

eSafety resources for Families

We have had a number of concerns recently regarding students' online behaviours, particularly on mobile phones. Any student who brings a phone to school must hand the phone in when they arrive at school and collect it at 3pm. Most social media sites (Facebook, Instagram, TikTok and Snapchat) require users to be 13 years and older to access. Please be aware of your child's online behaviours and interactions, considering where your children charge their device and how they access it during the day and night.
