
perspectives focus, Kindergarten had their first Bush Kindy session last week.

This term, Taylor Primary School will be involved in the School Review Process, as we near the end of our 5 year strategic plan focused on improving reading, writing, and student

wellbeing. School Review is a school improvement practice that provides us with an avenue to identify the effectiveness of our planning and management of school resources to improve student outcomes, evaluate progress towards Directorate and school priorities through using multiple sources of data. The review process creates a report based on the National School Improvement Tool and documents the 'next steps' to be incorporated into annual action plan. The school review team will be keen to speak with parents/carers to seek their input on Tuesday or Wednesday afternoon between 2.30-3.30pm (Week 8). Kindergarten

Kindergarten recently celebrated 100 days of learning at school with a wonderful day of 'all things 100' activities. It was fabulous to see the students refecting on their learning so far this year and clearly articulating their goals for the remainder of the year.

Science Week

This week students have been thinking creatively to solve problems around the

Science Week theme of "Innovation: Powering Future Industries". They have been challenged to create objects, using the right balance and types of materials, that will be neutrally buoyant in a tub filled with water. Students also created the ideal paper plane for accuracy and speed whilst learning about the forces of flight. They had the opportunity to participate in an online Q&A session with Australian astronaut in training Katherine Bennell-Pegg, who is currently in Germany training with the European Space Agency.



Library News

Thank you to our librarian Nike Paterson and the staff who hosted the Book Fair last week. Special thanks also to everyone who supported the book fair over the three days. The book fair sold just under \$4000 of reading materials. The school earns commission from this which will go back into purchasing books for our library. Next week is Book Week. Several activities will run over the week including library scavenger hunts, making bookmarks, and our book parade, which will occur on Wednesday 23 August at 9.15am during our whole school assembly.



Year 4 artwork

Year 4 recently completed a collaborative artwork using a quilling technique. Each student created an aspect of the piece, including features such as the balloon, and many hidden animals. The piece, framed by Mr Chris took several

weeks to complete. It is currently proudly on display in the Year 4 classroom.







Celebration of Learning

School Collaborations

This term, Taylor Primary School have been excited to welcome **Academy of Future Skills** educators into classrooms across the school. The Academy is a team of STEM specialist teachers within the ACT Education Directorate, who are available to work alongside teachers to deliver highly engaging inquiry units. In Year 2, students have been enthralled with their inquiry into chocolate, testing their predictions on which type would melt the quickest. Meanwhile in Year 4, students have been developing their programming skills, including how digital technology systems work and how to program using micro bits. During STEM lessons with Ms Turvey, the Academy have been working collaboratively to design units of work for years 1 to 4.





Combined Bands for Year 5 and 6 Ukulele

Our year 5 and 6 ukulele students participated in their second combined bands rehearsal this week. Year 6 travelled to Richardson primary and year 5 hosted other primary schools, here at Taylor Primary including performing to all

year 4-6 Taylor students. We continue to see our students' musical skills develop and the combined bands provides a wonderful opportunity to perform and collaborate as part of a larger group of musicians. Further rehearsals will be scheduled for term 4 in the lead up to a concert at the end of the year.
