Year 2 & 3 Excursions

This week saw some of our students enjoying enrichment opportunities to support their learning. On Wednesday, Year 3 headed out to Floriade and Nerang Pond, where they explored different natural and man-made features in Canberra. They found it fascinating that we have some man-made features that appear to be natural, and enjoyed discussing if a feature is natural or if it has been made purposely (eg. Lake Burley-Griffin). On Thursday, our Year 2 students enjoyed learning about different animals during a zookeeper tour at the National Zoo. Students were allowed to pet a snake, feed alpacas and deer, and our bravest year 2s even fed an emu from their heads! We are very grateful to our wonderful teachers for organising these opportunities to extend learning and the parent helpers who came along to help.

2024 Enrolments



The Education Directorate is reviewing policies related to student use of mobile phones and similar devices in all ACT public schools.

A new *Personal Use of Communication Devices in ACT public schools' policy* will be created to ensure that ACT public schools and classrooms are safe places that provide an effective and accessible learning environment for all students. It will outline the appropriate use of mobile phones and other communication devices by students. By providing feedback, you can help make sure the policy meets the needs and expectations of parents and carers.
