Garden and Green News at Taylor

Taylor Primary has partnered with the Sustainable Schools Program to further promote sustainability in our school and community. We have many exciting projects underway, and even more in the pipeline for 2024.

Students in our Green Team were recently involved in a waste audit to determine how well students and staff are currently using our recycling bins. This was a valuable learning experience for the students who will help in identifying goals and strategies to reduce contamination of our recycling streams.



Our Green Team continues to collect **plastic lids** from milk, yoghurt and drink containers. They have been busy cleaning and sorting lids ready to be recycled through Lids4Kids. *Remember to send in any lids from home* - these can be put in collection tubs in each classroom, or given to Ms Fellows.
