School Review

Next term, Taylor Primary School will be involved in the School Review Process. As we near the end of our 5 year strategic plan focused on improving reading, writing, and student wellbeing. School Review is a school improvement practice that provides us with an avenue to identify the effectiveness of our planning and management of school resources to improve student outcomes, evaluate progress towards Directorate and school priorities through using multiple sources of data. The review process creates a report based on the National School Improvement Tool and documents the 'next steps' to be incorporated into annual action plan. The school review team will be keen to speak with parents/carers to seek their input between 4-7 September (Week 8). We'll be asking for interested parents/carers mid-way through next term.

Collaborating in Science with Namadgi School



Preparing our students for high school is an important goal for our 5/6 team at Taylor. Taylor Primary is collaborating with Namadgi School to build relationships and understanding of high school for our year 5/6 students. In week 7, year 5/6 were fortunate to have a visit from a group of Namadgi student scientists, including ex-Taylor students Ruby and Lilja. They demonstrated how to make a lava lamp which was a great experiment linking to year 5/6 learning on the properties of liquids. It was also a great opportunity to learn more about the passion projects program at Namadgi, which includes the NASA science program. Thanks to Mr John Mantinaos from Namadgi, for organising this wonderful learning opportunity. We are looking forward to further collaborations in the future.

Combined Bands For Year 5 and 6 Ukulele

Our year 5 and 6 ukulele students participated in a combined bands rehearsal at Theodore Primary in week 5 with three other primary schools. This was not only a great opportunity to perform as part of a larger group of musicians but allowed students to collaborate with other schools and to develop their musical skills and confidence. Our ukulele players will also take part in combined bands rehearsals in term 3 and we are excited that Taylor will be hosting the year 5 rehearsal. Further rehearsals will be scheduled for term 4 in the lead up to a concert at the end of the year. Big skills for small bikes – Register for the July and September course now!

Families can now register for the big skills for small bikes course run by Pedal Power ACT. Big skills for small bikes is a learn to ride course for younger children aged 3-8, which focuses on teaching parents and carers how to get their kids riding confidently and safely. This is a beginner course best suited to kids who are not yet riding on their own unaided. The course includes 5 separate 45-minute sessions delivered each morning from Monday to Friday. Courses in the July and September school holidays are currently open for registration.
