

Taylor Primary School Term 2 Week 5 Newsletter- May 2023


Hello Taylor families

What a fabulous term it has been so far. Teachers and students have been working hard in their classrooms, producing high quality learning, whilst working towards their goals and earning PBL Mulliyans for being safe, respectful, responsible learners. Teachers and support staff have also been working towards their learning goals. Linked to our Strategic Plan, teachers are focusing on extending student understanding of reading strategies and comprehension as part of the Readers' workshop and focusing on a range of text types in writing.

At Taylor, we teach spelling through a Structured Word Inquiry (SWI) approach. English spelling is based around meaning (morphology), sounds (phonology) and word history (etymology). SWI uses all these elements to teach students how to spell words.

Taylor teachers are improving their SWI practice through a collaboration with four other SWI schools (Duffy Primary, Torrens Primary, Arawang Primary and Holy Trinity). Recently our teachers were able to learn from an expert in the field, Fiona Hamilton, as she modelled lessons and shared her practice at Duffy and Torrens Primary. Our teachers have shared their learning with each other and will continue to engage with Fiona and the four other schools later this term and throughout the year.

Our Learning Support staff are participating in a pilot program, with another ACT public school, run by the Education Directorate, over three sessions after school. The learning around understanding Inclusive Education within the ACT public education context, LSA roles within the ACT public education context, teacher/LSA relationship building and knowing our students and their needs will benefit our students and staff.

School Review

Next term, Taylor Primary School will be involved in the School Review Process. As we near the end of our 5 year strategic plan, School Review is a school improvement practice that provides us with an avenue to identify the effectiveness of our planning and management of school resources to improve student outcomes, evaluate progress towards Directorate and school priorities through using multiple sources of data. The review process creates a report based on the National School Improvement Tool and documents 'next steps' to be incorporated into our annual action plan. The school and the review team will be keen to speak with parents/carers to seek their input.

Reporting student achievement

At Taylor Primary School we have a number of ways we report on student achievement. Each of these strategies are aimed at providing families with clear feedback and an accurate understanding of their child's learning and wellbeing progress against the curriculum. Opportunities to meet with your child's teacher are offered throughout the year, however parents and carers are most welcome to make an appointment to see their child's teacher at any time. ACT public schools are expected to provide a written report to parents and carers of students from Preschool to Year 12, twice a year. These reports form part of the suite of relevant and purposeful opportunities schools use to communicate student learning to families throughout the year. Written reports for Semester 1 will include a general comment and will be emailed to families on Thursday 29 June (week 10).


